In response to the new challenges presented by the coronavirus pandemic, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has announced temporary flexibility in the requirements for completing Form I-9, Employment Eligibility Verification, while employers are operating remotely.

Some states have begun automatically extending the validity of identification cards and driver's licenses because of COVID-19.
